If the student is requesting transfer credit for **Advanced Physical Assessment, Advanced Pharmacology, and Advanced Pathophysiology** coursework must have been completed no more than 5 years prior to matriculation into the program and complete an online diagnostic reasoning test for the 3Ps with a pass score of 80%.

- If the coursework was taken greater than 5 years prior to matriculation to the program, student must enroll in all three courses for credit.
- If the student is an actively practicing advanced practice nurse (NP, CNS, CRNA, Mid-Wife) or CNL, and desires to change their specialty to the Family Nurse Practitioner they must submit syllabi from previous master's or post-master's nurse practitioner program for evaluation of equivalency.
- If student is an actively practicing advanced practice nurse in (NP, CNS, CRNA, Mid-Wife) or CNL, NRSC 604 Advanced Physical Assessment can be waived after demonstrating competency using the rubric for the final head-to-toe exam in NRSC 604.
