If the student is requesting transfer credit for **Advanced Physical Assessment**, **Advanced Pharmacology**, and **Advanced Pathophysiology** coursework must have been completed no more than 5 years prior to matriculation into the program and complete an online diagnostic reasoning test for the 3Ps with a pass score of 80%.

- If coursework was taken greater than 5 years prior to matriculation into the program, student must enroll in all three courses for credit.
- If student is an actively practicing advanced practice nurse (NP, CNS, CRNA, Mid-Wife) or CNL and desires to change their specialty to the Family Nurse Practitioner they must submit syllabi from previous master's or post-master's nurse practitioner program for evaluation of equivalency.
- If student is an actively practicing advanced practice nurse in (NP, CNS, CRNA, Mid-Wife) or CNL, NRSC 604 Advanced Physical Assessment can be waived after demonstrating competency using the rubric for the final head to toe exam of NRSC 604.

For completion of the program, a student will complete **630 direct clinical hours** as part of the Family Nurse Practitioner portion of the program (through clinical rotations) and **195 indirect clinical hours** (through DNP Project I, DNP Project II, and DNP Project III) as part of requirements for the Doctor of Nursing Practice degree.

NRSC 718 Independent Study may be necessary either to ensure completion of the 1000 post-baccalaureate hours required for the DNP (3-6 units) or to aid in ensuring completion of the Culminating Project (1-6 units) if not completed in NRSC 717 DNP Project III.

For these units, student must work with Culminating Project Chair to create objectives for the terms to ensure timely completion of indirect clinical hours and or the Culminating Project. The objectives for independent study must be on file in within the student's academic file.

- If used for indirect clinical hours for the DNP; one unit is equivalent to 60 hours of indirect clinical time.
  - Student may take more than 1 unit of independent study for indirect clinical hours to ensure completion of 1000 post baccalaureate hours per requirements of AACN.
  - For this program, a student may need to take at least 3 units of independent study for 180 indirect clinical hours to equal 1000 post baccalaureate clinical hours if the student has not transferred any clinical hours from their master's program.
- For Culminating Project completion, student must be enrolled in at least one unit per term to remain in program without exception.
  - Student must have objectives filed with the TUC SON and approval by his/her Culminating Project Chair and the DNP Program Coordinator prior to enrolling.
