



PUBLIC HEALTH PROGRAM 2016 MPH Student/Alumni Ambassador Application

Master of Public Health (MPH) student and alumni ambassadors are selected on the basis of leadership, scholarship, professionalism, and a desire to promote and represent the MPH Program at Touro University California (TUC) in person and online. Ambassadors uphold the philosophy, mission, and vision of the Program and the University by personal example and as TUC representatives. Ambassadors will encourage prospective students to choose TUC as their first choice for graduate and professional education, provide quality customer service to prospective students through campus tours, on/off campus recruitment activities, events and programs, and answer questions from prospective and entering students regarding academic programs, student activities, and campus life at TUC.

Student ambassadors will be matched with incoming students to provide them with a “buddy”—a resource for navigating the program, campus, and student life. Alum ambassadors will be available to speak to students about life after graduation, including tips on looking for that first public health job, and perspectives on what it is like to work in the field of public health.

To qualify as a student ambassador, students must have successfully completed at least 12 Public Health course units. Alum Ambassadors must have successfully completed all of the program requirements. Ambassadors may either self-nominate, or be nominated by faculty members.

Selected students and alumni will serve as ambassadors for 12 months, starting from the date of approval by the Public Health (PH) Recruitment and Admissions Committee. After 12 months, you will be contacted and asked if you would like to continue as a student or alum ambassador. Your contact information will also be updated at this time.

If you are interested in becoming an MPH Student or Alum Ambassador for the TUC Public Health Program, please follow these steps:

Step 1: Complete the application information on the reverse and return it via email, in person, or by mail, to Alicia Ashorn (alicia.ashorn@tu.edu) in the Public Health Program office, Wilderman Hall Room 402.

Step 2: Upon review of your application, you will be contacted for an interview by the PH Recruitment and Admissions Committee.

Step 3: Post interview with the PH Recruitment and Admissions Committee, you will be notified via email regarding your application status.
