Public Health Program **Social Justice in Public Health Fellowship** 2018-19 New Students

The Social Justice in Public Health Fellowships will be awarded to new students enrolled in the TUC MPH Program. Three \$1500 awards will be granted to three entering students in the 2018-19 academic year. One student will be selected from each of the following programs:

- Independent MPH
- Joint PA/MPH
- Dual Degree (DO or PharmD)

The purpose of the Social Justice in Public Health award is to recognize students who demonstrate a deep commitment to building leadership and advocacy skills toward the promotion of health among vulnerable populations. As part of this fellowship, students will also become part of a social justice student leadership team that will actively participate in furthering the social justice mission of the Public Health Program.

Specifically, Social Justice Fellows will be engaged in the following opportunities:

- Co-organizing/planning the annual Social Justice series for the following year (for fall 2019);
- Becoming a student member representative on the Public Health Program Community Advisory Board (which meets twice a year on campus); and
- Co-coordinating student and community engagement activities around the Richard Rothstein (Color of Law, author) symposium in February 2019.

Criteria for Selection of Fellows

Student must demonstrate:

- **Previous and/or current experience in community service and engagement, particularly with respect to the social determinants of health such as race, income, and education.**
- **Commitment to developing an understanding of the impact of social injustices on public health outcomes.**

Application Process

- Write an essay of no more than 500 words describing your commitment to **social justice as it relates to health equity based on your previous and or future work goals.**
- Submit a current copy of your résumé or CV.

All required information must be provided by the deadline in order for a nomination to be considered. Email your essay and résumé or CV to publichealth@tu.edu.
