Dr. Juan Salinas is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Sociology at Sonoma State University. He received his PhD from Texas A&M University.

Dr. Salinas' research and teaching interests include race and ethnicity, immigration, Latino sociology, and health inequality. He has researched inequalities caused by having an undocumented status in labor, educational attainment, and mental health. His current research focuses on white employers and Latino immigrant laborers for studying how race, immigration, and undocumented status shape labor and health inequalities in the workplace.

Dr. Salinas' research has contributed a book chapter to a forthcoming edited volume entitled *Latino Peoples in the New America: Racialization and Resistance*.
